About the Cardz For Kidz Student Program

ardz For Kidz is a Chicago-based nonprofit organization that hand-delivers hope to hospitalized children, seniors, veterans, and traumatized patients across the world through handmade cards.

We launched the Cardz For Kidz Student Program ahead of the 2021-22 school year to cultivate a network of student volunteers in high schools and colleges across the nation. We included all the information you need to start a chapter at your school.





What is Cardz For Kidz?

In 2004, Cardz For Kidz founder Ike Nwankwo underwent brain surgery after a bout with epilepsy. When he was twelve years old, Ike had begun volunteering at children's hospitals, delivering snacks and support to patients and their families. Years later, as a patient, Ike experienced first-hand the toll of being hospitalized on patients and their families. Armed with this experience and more than twenty years of volunteering in pediatric hospitals, Ike launched Cardz For Kidz in 2010. At first, the organization focused solely on delivering cards to pediatric patients; now, Cardz For Kidz also supports seniors, veterans, and other groups. Since our founding, we have delivered more than 400,000 cards to over 400 locations, uplifting spirits worldwide. We encourage you to learn more about us on our website.

How to Start a Chapter

hile starting your own Cardz For Kidz chapter may seem like a daunting task, we made a step-by-step guide to make the process easier!

Step 1: Find Out How to Start a Chapter at Your School

Because the process varies by school, it is essential to know the requirements for starting an organization at your school before anything else.

You can find this information by contacting an administrator or consulting your school's website.

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Step 2: Gain Approval from Your School

As previously noted, the requirements and processes of founding a club vary by school; however, here are a few items your school will **likely** require:

1. A sponsor

2. A club constitution and/or mission statement

With these in mind, here are the **next steps** you might take to secure approval for your chapter:

1. Recruit several friends to help

Having the help of friends makes starting a club easier.

Reach out to 1-3 people who share your passion for service and with whom you work well.

2. Find a sponsor

At most schools, having a sponsor is an absolute necessity for starting a club. Find a faculty member at your school who:

- Shares your passion for the mission of Cardz For Kidz and helping others
- Is willing and able to host weekly or bi-weekly meetings in their classroom at lunch or after school
- Is willing to assist with tasks such as mailing cards and obtaining materials

3. Write a club constitution, a mission statement, or both

Some schools require prospective organizations to submit a constitution detailing their purpose and structure, a mission statement, or both. Find out if either of these is required.

4. Ask for approval

Complete anything else you must do and ask your administrator for approval.



Step 3: Register Your Chapter

Once your chapter has gained approval from your school, <u>make sure to register as an official Student Program chapter.</u>

Registration allows your chapter to receive important information and be a member of the Student Program community.

Step 4: Grow Your Chapter

1. Promote your chapter on your social media accounts

Your social media accounts are an effective way to reach your classmates.

- For optimal engagement, individually message friends and classmates: personalized messages capture their attention
- Share a message about your chapter on your Instagram or Snapchat story

2. Reach out to friends and classmates

Cast a wide net; you never know who may be interested.

3. Ask your school to promote your chapter on its social media accounts

Many schools have social media accounts; reach out to whoever manages them to promote your chapter.

4. Post a flyer around your school building

Capture students' attention while they walk through the halls.

5. Advertise in your school newspaper and daily announcements

Both are effective means of reaching the student body.

6. Showcase your chapter at your school's club fair

Club fairs are a great way to connect with prospective members.



Step 5: Prepare for Your First Meeting

What you need to do before meeting:

1. Establish a Consistent Meeting Time

Establish a time that works for you, your sponsor, and the plurality of your members. Try to maintain this time to avoid confusion.

2. Establish a Leadership Team

Having a small team to help you with running your chapter makes everything a whole lot easier.

3. Gather Materials

2. Raffles

Raffles are a fun and engaging way to raise money and promote your chapter to the student body at your school. During a sporting event or lunch is a great time to hold a raffle—the prize can be 50% of the total proceeds, a goodie basket, gift card, or another desirable item.

3. Krispy Kreme Donut Sale

Raise money by selling delicious donuts to students and teachers at your school. Find more information <u>here</u>.



4. Pizza or bake sale

Set up a table during lunch or as school lets out to sell snacks to passing students.



5. Popcorn or cookie dough sale

There are many vendors you can partner with to sell goodies to students at your school.

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Fundraising Alternatives

A few ways you can gather materials in case fundraising does not satisfy your monetary needs:

1. Ask your administration about a stipend

Some schools offer a small stipend to help organizations cover their costs. Your school may be one of them.

2. Ask your members to pitch in

You may be able to raise enough money for your club's materials by asking your members to contribute a small sum.

3. Ask members to donate materials

Some members may have materials at their house or be willing to purchase materials for the chapter

4. Ask your art teacher for donations

Your art teacher may have extra materials and be willing to help out your chapter.

5. Ask a local crafts store for a donation

A free and viable option for gathering card-making materials.
